### SECTION 4: First aid measures

#### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

<b>General information</b>	In case of accident or if you feel unwell, seek medical advice immediately (show the label where possible). Advice for Medical Doctors: Bromadiolone is an indirect anti-coagulant. Phytomenadione, Vitamin K, is antidotal. Determin prothrombin time not less than 18 hours after consumption. If elevated, administer Vitamin K1 until prothrombin time normalises. Continue determination of prothrombin time for two weeks after withdrawal of antidote and resume treatment if elevation occurs in that time.
<b>Inhalation</b>	Due to the physical nature of this product, exposure by this route is unlikely. Seek medical attention if symptoms persist.
<b>Ingestion</b>	Rinse mouth. Do not induce vomiting. Get medical attention immediately.
<b>Skin contact</b>	May cause irritation to susceptible persons. If skin irritation occurs wash with soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing. Get medical attention if symptoms are severe or persist.
<b>Eye contact</b>	May cause eye irritation to susceptible persons. Rinse immediately with plenty of water and seek medical advice.
